





THE WHY

We collect qualitative and quantitative data on the effectiveness of our projects. The following composite self-reported data (which is fairly representative of the majority of our programs) is from Skyway and Columbia Elementary Schools (N=41).

- 59% increase in hard skills and tool use
- 21% increase in abilities trying something new
- 27% increase in abilities sharing ideas and
presenting to a group




